 - We will work heavily on skills such as critical thinking, research, teamwork, reading, writing, and delivering presentations.

Expectations:

- ***RESPECT YOURSELVES and THOSE AROUND YOU***
- Come to class on time and be **prepared** in your correct seat with your book, notebook/binder, and a writing utensil (you will not be allowed to leave for a locker trip)
 - Keep yourself organized!
- You will need a three ring notebook (for notes, handouts, writing, etc) and an in-class journal.
- You are responsible for your actions and will be held accountable for them.
 - Choose helpful actions: Sit in your seat, Participate, Be Attentive, Listen, etc.
 - Positive Actions = Positive Consequences
 - Negative Actions = Negative Consequences
- Leave distractions outside of class (**phones**, spinners, cubes, toys, etc.)
- ***HAVE FUN! - The atmosphere of this class is largely up to YOU!***

In Class:

- The classroom is an important place that must be treated as such.
- All students will be expected to follow the student handbook and conduct themselves in a way that encourages a high functioning learning environment. If a student chooses to challenge this expectation, he/she may be subject to the following:
 1. 1st instance = Warning (Whistle)
 2. 2nd instance = Warning 2 (Yellow Card)
 3. 3rd instance = Detention with Mr. Egedy and Communication with Home (Red Card)

Homework, Projects, and other Assignments:

- Expect Homework three to four times a week (usually not more than 20 minutes a night)
- ***ALL WORK IS DUE*** at the **BEGINNING** of class unless otherwise specified.
- You may turn in late work. However, habitual late work will lower your Work Habits grade and can prevent a student from being on Honor Roll. Expect a message home if missing assignments are frequent.
- Late work will be accepted until the end of a unit only.
- All assignments are expected to be completed unless otherwise specified. Missing work will be recorded as an M and will be scored as a zero until turned in.

Unsatisfactory	1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • >9 missing, incomplete, or late homework assignments per semester • Does not complete coursework • More than twice a week is unprepared and without required class materials • Regularly unproductive in class

Grading:

- Grades serve as a useful communication tool to quantify student achievement to students, parents, other teachers, etc. The goal of grading is to facilitate student learning and success.
- Standard Grading System: 90-100 = A, 80-89 = B, 70-79 = C, 60-69 = D, 59-50 = F
- All grades (i.e. Homework, Quizzes, Tests, etc) will be AVERAGED together.
- Effort, behavior, attitude, and time on task will be submitted as a *Citizenship* grade.
- Preparation, timeliness, and productivity will be part of a *Work-Habits* grade.
- Large assignments will have a rubric so you will know what is expected.
